MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Hi, welcome to the village of Buchanan June 3, 2025 board meeting. Please join me in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MULTIPLE: I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, liberty and justice for all.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Okay. And in case of emergency, please use the door, the emergency exit here or use the stairwell behind the elevator. Please do not use the elevator. Thank you.

I am going to change the agenda a little bit. We are going to move the last item, number H. Anthony, to -- we have a new hire here and I've asked Anthony to read the -- make a motion for the hiring of the new employee.

MR. ANTHONY CAPICOTTI: Good evening everybody. So I would like to consider a motion to hire Anthony Panettieri as a laborer at an annual rate of \$45,000 as of June 20, 2025, contingent on passing all hiring requirements of

3	MS. AWILDA BAEZ: Second.
4	MR. CAPICOTTI: All in favor?
5	MULTIPLE: Aye.
6	MR. CAPICOTTI: Thank you.
7	MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Thank you.
8	Congratulations. Welcome aboard. And you'll find
9	that this is a good group of guys in the highway
10	department. They're, you know, they're good
11	workers, they're good people and they work hard
12	for the village. Anybody want to make a comment?
13	MR. RANDY HASSELGRAVE: Yeah.
14	MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Randy, our highway
15	foreman, thank you, Randy.
16	MR. HASSELGRAVE: All right, Mayor and
17	the board.
18	MR. SERRANO: Why don't you come up,
19	come up next to Randy.
20	MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Yeah, so everyone
21	can see, see who you are.
22	MR. SERRANO: Yeah, come on up.
23	MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Hope you're not shy.
24	MR. HASSELGRAVE: I didn't want to say

15	MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Okay and you don't
16	have to stay through the meeting if you don't
17	want but if you want to see what's going on,
18	you're more than welcome to stay. I jumped ahead
19	but I'd like to make a motion to approve the
20	minutes of February 25th, the workshop meeting
21	April 22nd workshop meeting and May 6th board
22	meeting. Any questions, comments on the minutes?
23	MR. LAKER: No.
24	MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Okay. Can I have a

1 June 3, 2025 2 second? 3 MR. LAKER: Second. 4 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All in favor? 5 MULTIPLE: Aye. 6 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All right, comments 7 from the floor? Any comments from the floor? Okay. All right, under new business we have done 8 9 this before. We had a, had a public hearing. Oh, 10 I have to open another public hearing. Okay, I'd 11 like to make a motion to open a public hearing 12 regarding a renewal franchise agreement with 13 Verizon. Can I have a second? 14 MR. STEWART: Second 15 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All in favor? 16 MULTIPLE: Aye. 17 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Okay, thank you. So 18 we have had a public hearing before and it's 19 about renewing our franchise with Verizon and we 20 already did it with Optum and what happened is 21 there was a glitch in uploading this. And so we are resetting, you know, the public hearing for 22 2.3 tonight so that we can officially close this. So

are there any comments? Like I said, we put this

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out to the public before the public hearing. All right, I'd like to make a motion to close the public hearing. Can I have a second?

MR. LAKER: Second.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All in favor?

MULTIPLE: Aye.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: And that's all I had to do, I just have the open and close that. All right, the next is a motion toward a bid for the roadway improvement project 2025 to Morano Brothers Corporation. We had our engineer here last time and he spoke about this, about what the project entailed. This is Church Street in Buchanan. This is near a nursery school, this is a road that's in need of repair. This went out to bid. There were five bidders. The work consists of asphalt milling and paving, the installation of drainage improvements along Church Street, other related work shall include adjusting and repairing drainage structures and sanitary manhole structures, adjusting utility frames and covers to grade, as well as preparing, restoring and cleaning the project area, all in accordance

1 June 3, 2025 2 with the plans and specifications as directed by the engineer. So the lowest responsible bidder 3 4 was Morano Brothers. The total base amount is 5 \$428,985. The bids range from that and the high bid was \$598,000. So I'd like to make a motion to 6 7 accept the lowest bidder, base bid Morano Brothers for the road improvement project 2025. 8 9 Can I have a second? 10 MR. LAKER: Second. 11 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All in favor? 12 MULTIPLE: Aye. 13 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Thank you. The next 14 is we're going to be extending the bid, bid which 15 was awarded on July 2nd 2024 for the gate valve 16 replacement project the contractor is Pezzella 17 Brothers. He has agreed to keep the same rate, 18 the same price. So I'd like to make a motion to 19 extend the bid, which was awarded on July 2, 2024 20 for the gate replacement valve project. Can I 21 have a second?

MULTIPLE: Aye.

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MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All in favor?

MS. BAEZ: Second

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MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Thank you. Okay, the next is we discussed this at our workshop. There is a -- we have a surplus fund balance. We discussed different projects that we could use this money for and the board was in agreement for getting a new chipper which is 51,000, a police vehicle 65,000, so a total out of that will be 116,000. So I would like to also speak to the board at the next workshop to see if there's any other projects that they might be interested, or any other work that they might be interested in.

The other is I know the fire department, the Buchanan engine was here once before. The air truck needs repairs at an approximate cost of \$150,000. Fortunately, we have a vehicle replacement fund for the fire department, so that will come out of the that will come out of the vehicle replacement fund. The other money will come out of the surplus in the fund balance. So I'd like to make a motion, unless anyone has comment or questions on that?

MR. CAPICOTTI: I have a question on the air truck.

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2 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Sure.

MR. CAPICOTTI: We are going to take bids. Chief, the assistant chief is here. We're going to, I mean 150,000 is what we're looking at as the top, right. So we are going to get bids on that. Hopefully, like I said last time I hope they're aggressive bids. That doesn't seem -- it seems like a big number for something like that, but.

MR. KIERAN OUTHOUSE: The biggest part of that is a new compressor.

MR. CAPICOTTI: Yeah. All right. No, I, know it needs to get done, so hopefully we'll get good bids on that so we won't have to spend all that money.

MR. STEWART: I just had a question too, mayor, in relation to the police vehicle. I saw Randy was good enough to put together some useful information in relation to the condition of the existing squad cars. And I see where we have a lot of idle time on these cars. And it seems to be causing a lot of wear and tear. So the -- my question is on the new vehicles that we're

And then out of the fire department replacement fund, equipment replacement fund, repairs to the air truck for \$150,000 Can I have a second?

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All in favor?

MULTIPLE: Aye.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Okay, Dan I'd like you to do the next authorizing employment of recreation personnel.

MR. STEWART: Sure. So we'd, I'd like to consider a motion authorizing the employment of recreation personnel for the camp at the following rates. Director 5,100 for the season, assistant director 4,800 for the season, nurse \$25 an hour, labor \$18 an hour, art specialist \$16.50 an hour, sports specialists \$16.50 an

20	for other complaints. They had 32 calls for that.
21	They had 30 calls for property checks. They also
22	had 44 moving summons, three parking summons and
23	a total of 175 calls for the month of April.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Okay. All right,

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thank you, Awilda. Highway report, April 2025.

MR. CAPICOTTI: April '25, the monthly report, 69.82 tons of household garbage, bulk and dumpsters 12.94 tons, dumpsters only 15.42 tons, metal 2.39 tons and seven TVs. The guys were busy getting prepped for the areas, especially the recreation areas, the ball fields, the pool was inspected by our inspector. They had a Sherman Williams guy come out and talk about how we're going to use our new line painting machine. The chippers were active. We had a lot going on with a lot getting ready to do our, our summer duties with grass cutting and other responsibilities. And there is a bunch of pictures here that the guys were very busy in April, very busy. Thank you.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Wastewater treatment plant April 2025, I just had that [unintelligible] [00:13:24]. There you are. Thanks, Steve. Treated wastewater, 11 million gallons, sludge removal 175 gallons, and there's six lab reports, one for Westchester County

There were some, there was 14 building permits issued or reviewed. Inspections required 6 7 for newly issued permits, 12 inspections on file for permits and compliance inspections 19, 8 9 certificates of occupancy, there was 15 issued. 10 And then there's court hearings for Blakeley 11 Avenue coming. And there, there were zero 12 property maintenance issues reported and zero 13 illegal apartments. 14 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All right, thank 15 you. Prosecutors report, there is nothing this 16 month, zoning board minutes, April 16th received 17 and filed. 18 MR. LAKER: Sorry, Can we just go back 19 with the prosecutor's report? 20 MS. KNICKERBOCKER: Yes. 21

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MR. LAKER: I noticed that this has been kind of reoccurring. I don't know the last time I've seen a report from the prosecutor. Has anybody had contact with her and is that that a

11	said when I have something to prosecute I'll
12	prosecute.
13	MR. LAKER: Okay. So is there nothing to
14	prosecute or there
15	MR. SERRANO: It's interesting. There
16	was there was a court proceeding regarding that
17	piece of property on Blakeley Avenue.
18	MR. LAKER: Mm-hmm.
19	MR. SERRANO: And, and the court missed
20	the, the, the notification to the property owner.
21	So it was postponed to next month. So, the
22	prosecutor did, they show up, Peter was there. We
23	were ready to go, and but the person never showed
24	up and never got notified. So really, there

LAKER: And then there's also this 6 7 special prosecutor for a different matter, 8 correct? 9 MR. SERRANO: Yes. I haven't got an 10 update on that yet. So that, I just put it down 11 to get an update for the next meeting. 12 MS. PORTEUS: Yeah, he was waiting, I 13 was waiting on some insurance for him. The insurance carrier was away, but I did hear 14 15 probably a week ago now, and I think he -- I met 16 him here. He gathered a bunch of documents. 17 MR. SERRANO: A bunch of information. 18 Maybe he's just reviewing the documents, you 19 know. 20 MS. PORTEUS: That's what I think. The 21 last time I heard from him, he had given me the 22 insurance certificate and he said that they were 2.3 weeding through it. So I'm hoping that'll move 24 along. But I'll touch base with him to see,

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for engineering costs. We got a response just recently saying that we need to contact the DEC and NYSERDA. So we, so George sent an email to the DEC. The DEC says we'll get back to you. I haven't gotten a response about that yet. So right now Tom's passed it to the DEC and I don't know what the process. So we asked for the process, does the process now be that the DEC have to approve engineering, then it goes to NYSERDA and then back to the state to be approved for the release of the funds? I, we don't know what the process is and we're still waiting for response. So I just want to let the board know we're in a holding pattern right now because George cannot do any work, because they're saying there's no reimbursement at this point. So I just want to let the board know that's the only hold up at this point is the funding of the release of the Entergy money.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: okay. I will speak to Tom Congdon. I have to speak to him about something with the DOB and then my contacts at the DEC and see how we can expedite and get that

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2 moving while the weather is working with us here.

MR. SERRANO: Yep.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: All right. Thank you. Okay. So, the last Wednesday I was at the New York Conference of Mayors annual meeting, I came back Thursday. I wanted to be at the -- the village got a commendation and I know Marcus you had sent an invitation to all the board members.

MR. SERRANO: Mm-hmm.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: The Westchester

Municipal Planning Federation, and I was happy to
be there. The previous -- there was a previous
board that had worked on a C1-C2 overlay
district. It was almost a year that we worked on
that. And there was a former planning board
chairman that was on the board at the time, a
former zoning board chairman on the board. And we
looked at the 9A corridor. We were interested in,
you know, encouraging development or, or fixing
some of the properties there. So that's why the
C1-C2 overlay district was created. Also, we took
the time to look at the character of the village
and what, you know, what we thought would fit

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there and what type of development we'd like to see.

So the original direction was that it would be it would be three stories, to keep in line with the character of the village, but not only that, there was also a retail component to that. And we went back and forth many, many times. Some of the board members had wanted all retail on the first floor. Some were okay with just a little bit of retail. So then, you know, then developers came in and then, you know, of course that changed.

And so, but it's still, it's a basis for the rest of the 9A corridor. You see some of the businesses having the commercial on the bottom and residential on the top is, you know, which was what we were looking to do, especially on the 9A corridor. And you see the old gas station down there, they took that down. The latest I heard is they're looking to put commercial on the bottom floor, two businesses and then two apartments above. So that's the property across from [unintelligible] [00:20:07]. So you do, you do,

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you're, you're seeing some development in that area.

wanted to tell you what it said in their booklets. So we got a commendation for C1-C2 overlay zoning. The village of Buchanan adopted a C1-C2 overlay district zoning, along with companion design guidelines, planning documents to promote and encourage business and residential development while beautifying the existing commercial corridor, improve pedestrian linkage along Albany Post Road corridor and to connect the development to the Village Circle commercial district.

So this is Westchester Municipal
Planning Federation 2025 commendation for
outstanding planning achievement presented to the
Village of Buchanan for the planning and
implementation of a C1-C2 overlay zoning. So this
is what this looks like.

And with me was Nick Zachary, who was on the board at the time and now is a current planning board chairman and also he was a, at one

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time a planning -- a zoning board chairman for many years. So Nick has extensive knowledge on the village, you know, planning and zoning issues.

C1-C2 overlay zoning and with the AMS project. So
I think you know that occurring 24 months ago I
think it's important that we recognize that the
project that's going on now was, was, you know,
one of the deciding factors in this, this award.
And I think the village should be proud of that.

But he says that they usually know who the dog belongs to. They, if the dog is friendly, they look at the tag. And they do try to support in capturing the dog. But the resident was half right. They're not really supposed to touch the dog, because if anything happens to the dog or happens to them, then

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there's a bigger issue.

MR. CAPICOTTI: But it is a big number that is going to be involved with engineering over there, because it is a tremendous amount of work. So I don't know if we should consider putting it out to bid for engineering firms to come in and look into that or are we just

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exclusively just going to hand it over to George?

MR. SERRANO: So just an update on that, he's going to be at the -- he wants to be at the next workshop. He's gathering the data, so he can provide the village what would an estimate cost and at that point you have an idea what it would be and then you can make a decision how you want to move forward.

MR. CAPICOTTI: Yeah, that's going to be a big number because there's a lot of work there for engineering. And George is, is very well trained in our plant. I get it. I get it. But it is a big number, so it's going to be a big part of our expenses there, so.

Another thing is I, I was a part of the board that adopted the overlay C1-C2 district and, and I did get an email from you and I completely forgot about it. And I would have liked to gone as well, you know. I, I also would like to congratulate Sean Murray and Rich Funchion, who also were a part of that adopting that C1-C2. Because without that adoption, like Steve said, we transitioned a little bit. We had

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to make an amendment to the, the overlay to accommodate for AMS. But that ball would have never got rolling if that process wasn't completed the way it was. So, all that were involved I have to commend them. And I, I wish I would have remembered because I would have liked to have gone. But there was, there was a few of us that were involved. And I'm glad that we did because the corridor, there is a lot of possibilities that can go on in that corridor because of that overlay adoption. So, I'm excited to see what comes out of it after this. But, anyway thank you, Mayor for going and, and representing us at the, at this event.

MS. KNICKERBOCKER: So yeah, I, I did
mention the planning and zoning board chairmans,
but yes, you're right. It was, it was you, it was
myself it was Sean Murray, it was Rich Funchion
and Nick Zachary were on the board. And we, you
know, Anthony, we went back and forth on many
things with that, especially the retail. But we,
we did come to some type of a consensus in the
end and --
